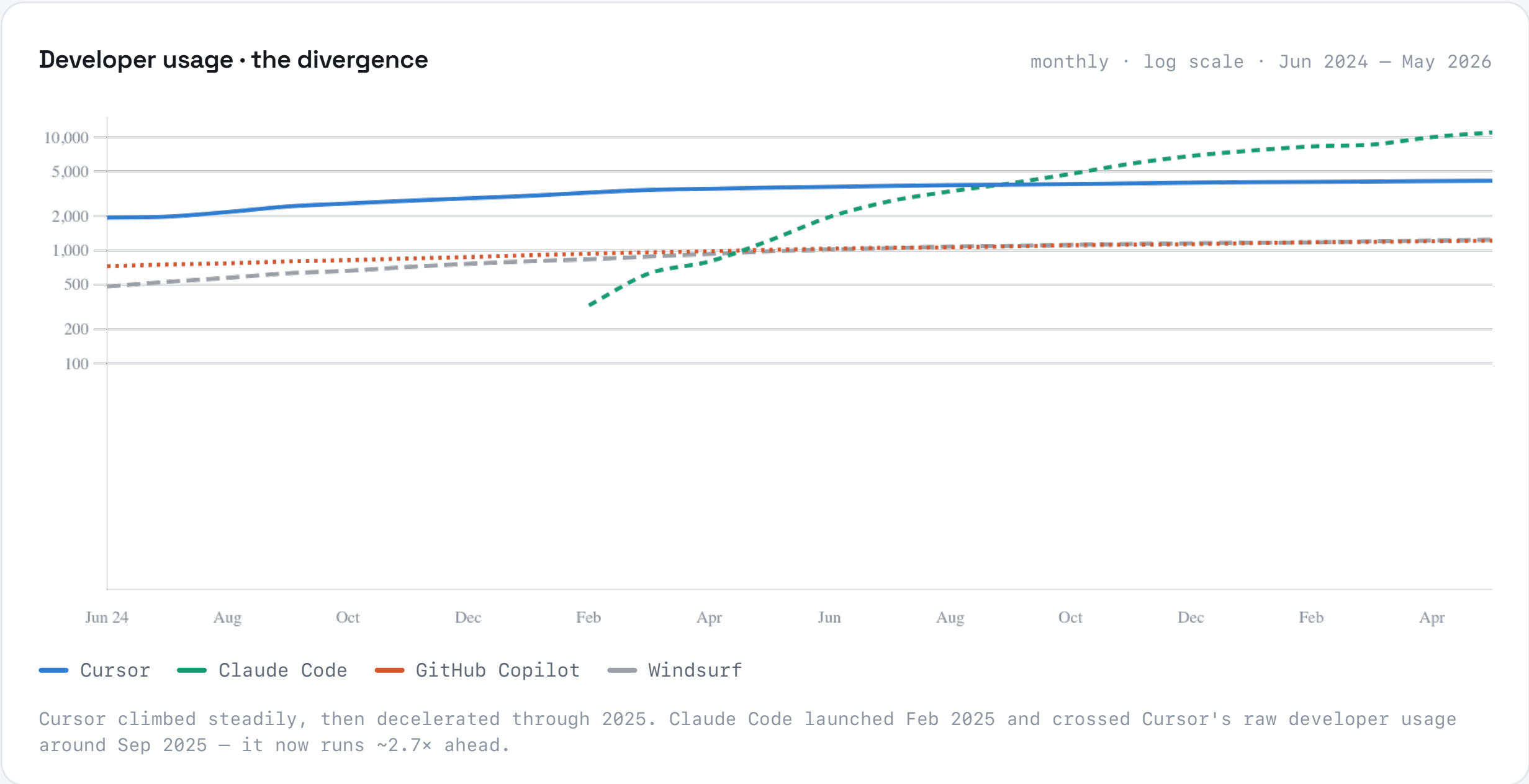


Is Cursor overhyped?

The data says the opposite: Cursor is a real, still-growing category leader with strong momentum, ~2,000+ enterprise adopters, the second-largest developer footprint in AI coding. **However:** over the past 24 months, Cursor has been **out-accelerated inside its own category** by the model layer it sits on top of.



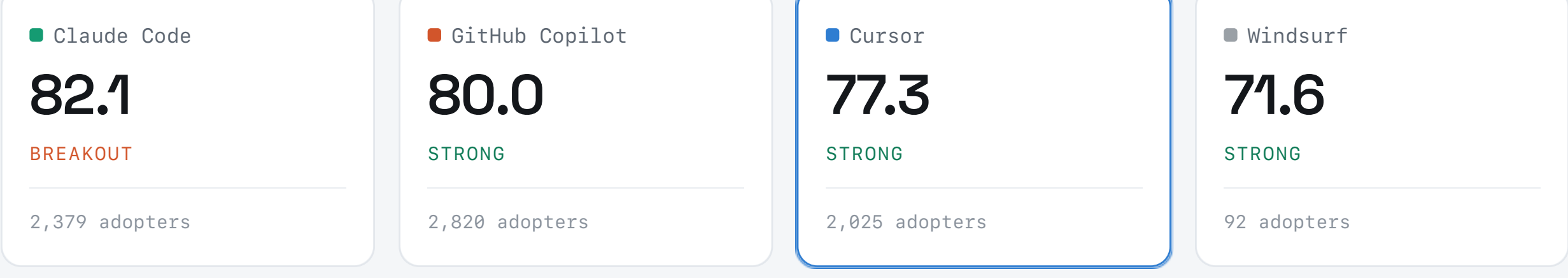
THE VERDICT

Not overhyped, **out-accelerated**. Cursor leads on reach and entrenchment, but momentum has rotated to **Claude Code**, which sits one layer below **Cursor** in the stack. The question is whether an application-layer tool can hold share as the model layer moves up into its space.

01 / MOMENTUM

Where Cursor sits today

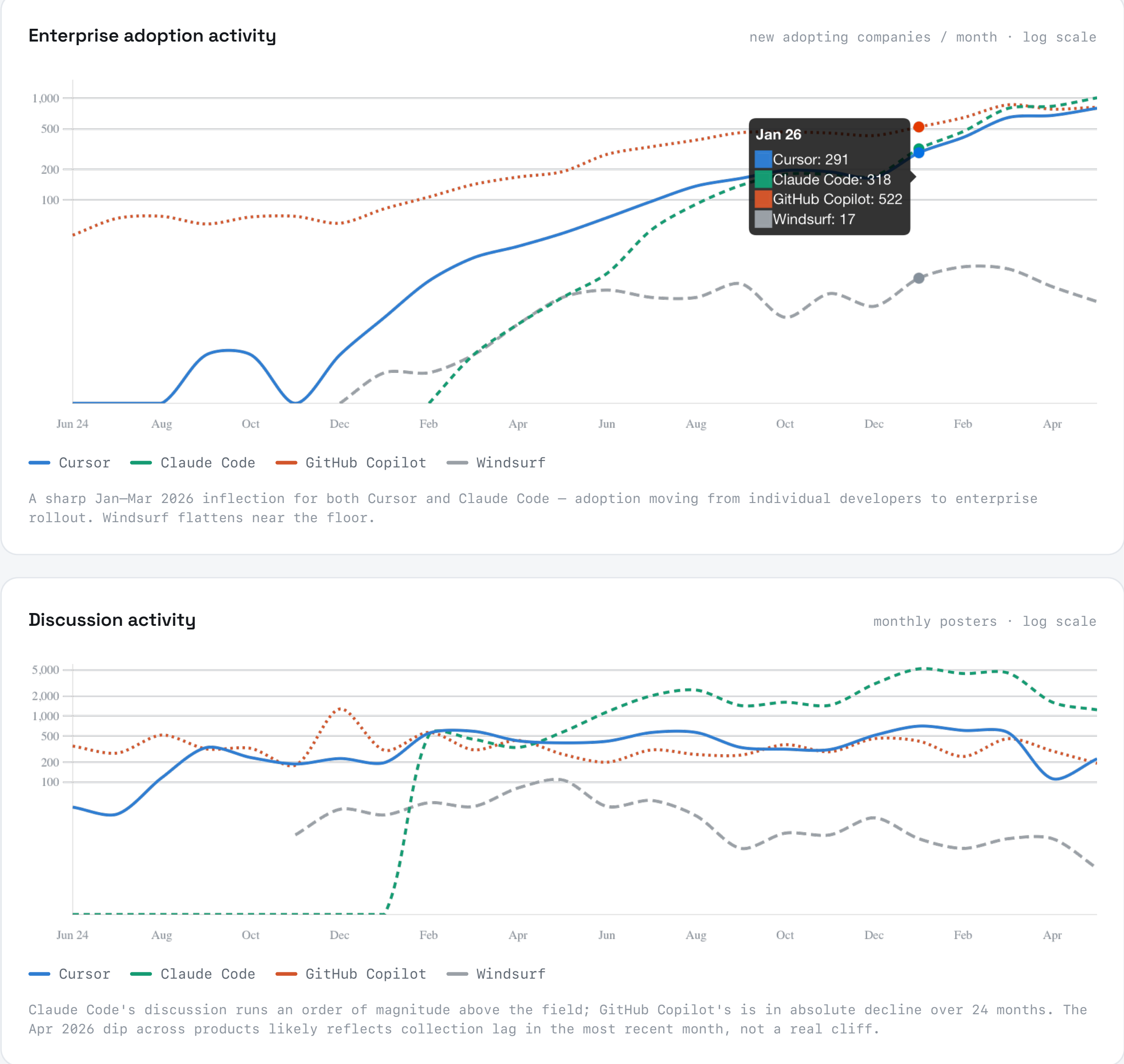
ATC's composite momentum blends growth pace, activity volume, acceleration, and adoption by influential companies into a 0–100 score. All four AI coding tools rank Strong or higher; the category is among the highest-momentum in the universe. Cursor is third of four.



02 / TRAJECTORY

Two years of signal, month by month

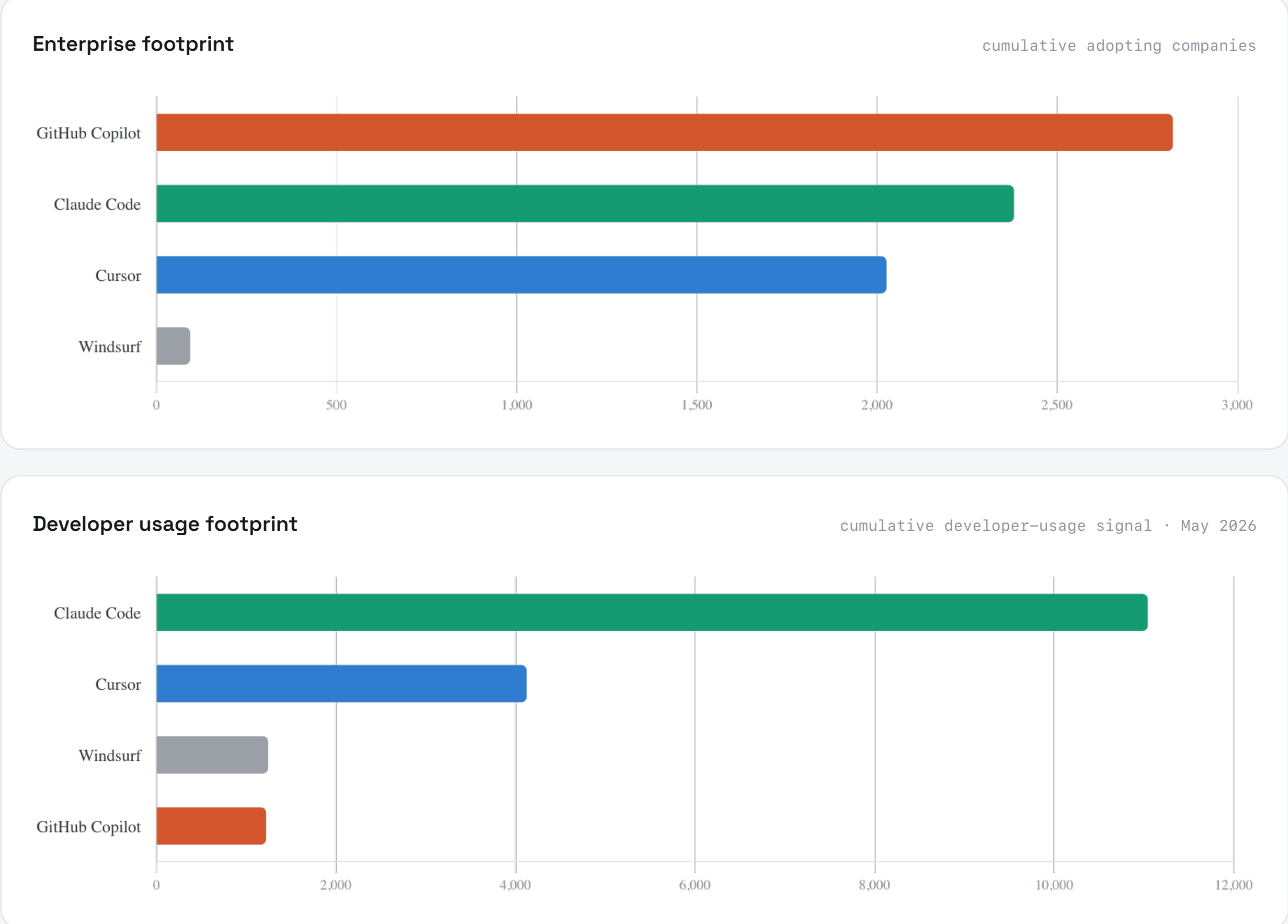
The monthly series shows when Cursor's growth normalized, when Claude Code broke out, and when enterprise adoption inflected.

Reach versus momentum

Cursor's strength is footprint. It holds the second-largest developer-usage base in the category and sits firmly in the leading pack on enterprise adopters, and orders of magnitude clear of also-rans like Windsurf.

Where Cursor wins, where it's exposed

WHERE CURSOR WINS

- Enterprise reach**
~2,025 enterprise adopters and 2,468 companies carrying a Cursor signal, including Halliburton, Under Armour, MITRE, and a16z. Second-largest developer footprint in the category at 4,118.
- Balanced profile**
Discussion, usage, and adoption signals move together rather than discussion towering over substance — the profile of a real product, not a hype cycle. Deeply embedded in the modern AI dev stack.
- Still growing**
Developer usage rose +112% over 24 months and is still climbing. Enterprise adoption inflected sharply upward in early 2026.

WHERE CURSOR IS EXPOSED

- Growth laggard**
Developer-usage growth of +15% YoY is real but the slowest of the four. Claude Code crossed Cursor's raw usage in Sep 2025 and now leads on usage, discussion, and adopters despite launching later.
- Disintermediation risk**
The product gaining share fastest sits one layer below Cursor — the model provider Cursor resells. Category consolidation toward the model labs is the structural threat.
- Moat narrative**
The developer corpus surfaces pricing backlash and the explicit "same models — what's the moat versus Copilot?" argument, plus documented migration to Claude Code and Codex.
